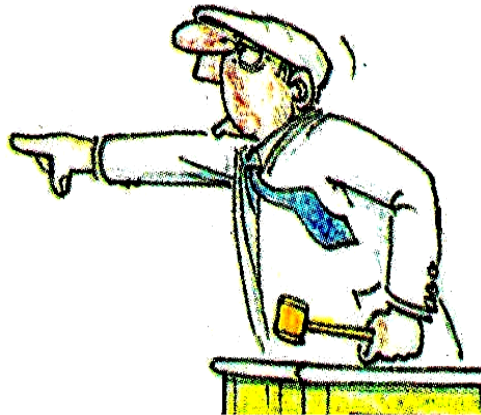

FAT CATTLE

We had a much better show than expected considering the bright spell of weather was bringing out both hay making and harvesting equipment at the same time.

There were 214 cattle on parade of which 126 were young bulls, 80 clean and 8 OTM's.

The bull trade was pretty similar holding up at 195p for the continentals throughout the day.

Andrew Thompson topped the market with two British Blues making 222p/kg bought by Matthew Fitton and Brian Glaves.

First behind was Anthony Turnbull on 220p with Tony Potter and Millington Grange both hitting 217p/kg.

On a headage basis, Carl Fawcett had a magnificent 800kg Blonde d'Aquitaine bull that added up to £1656; Frank Pickering had another large Limousin making £1622 and Doug Shirt followed with a British Blue on £1541.

The black and white trade hovered around 160p/kg and the best British Friesian came from Doug Shirt on 189p/kg with Mark Nicholson on 185p, Alan Sykes 178p and Norman Colley 176p/kg.

There were some good clean cattle in the market and the Continentals in this section averaged 205p/kg.

The top 14 prices were all heifers and Tony Potter led the field with a British Blue on 245p followed by Tony Barker who then had 4 heifers make 244p/kg; Pam Gibson followed on 242p with N Hall on 240p/kg.

The highest priced steers were shown by the Gilbertson family, making 229p and 226p respectively.

The OTM's were surprisingly scarce today but Chris Kirby had an overage Friesian steer make 175p and the highest priced cow made 127p/kg.

FAT SHEEP

440 sheep turned out this Monday of which 350 were lambs and 90 cull ewes. Trade is holding pretty steady at 190p but the best of spring lambs are still making a good premium.

Mark Lofthouse again topped the table at 229p/kg, just beating David Bristow on 227p, Carl Fawcett 226p and Brian Robinson 213p/kg.

Headage wise it was J Thompson who had some heavy lambs that made £96.50 while Mark Lofthouse hit £96, David Bristow £95.50 and David Gay £93.

The ewes just made up to a top of £98 but averaged £63 through the market.

FAT PIGS

414 pigs went through our system this week of which 184 came into the live auction on Monday.

The live trade was unexpectedly better than last week with averages hovering at 116 to 118p/kg. The lighter pigs commanded a premium and top this week was Peter Ownsworth with a pen of gilts making 127p/kg.

Next came Andrew Thompson with 7 pens of pigs making from 124 to 126p and then G H West on 121p and B Blackburn 118p/kg.

Our deadweight service saw 230 pigs sold with the cutters making 156p and the bacon pigs 152p/kg.
