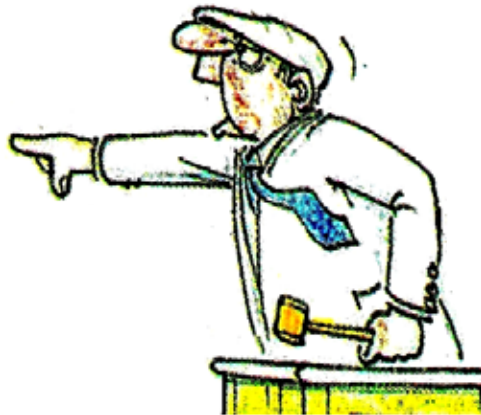

FATSTOCK REPORT MONDAY 2ND JULY 2012

FAT CATTLE

The trade continues to hold itself together with all the Continental averages back over 200p/kg again.

There are a few ripples in the trade, mainly driven by the difficulty selling meat at the consumer end; inevitably this filters back into the live auction.

Nevertheless, shortage of numbers is keeping the price up.

We had a total of 237 cattle of which 116 were young bulls, 98 clean and 23 OTM's. Keith Bowes had three quite outstanding bulls this week all of which achieved an E classification, and he topped the market at 226p/kg.

Derek Woolhouse then had two pure Limousins make 224p with Maxwell Brothers having another pair on 223p and G H West on 221p/kg.

On a headage basis, Patrick Beal was rewarded for his courage in feeding three 800kg bulls which made from £1575 to £1613. Frank Pickering also had a bull at £1546 with Derek Woolhouse's Limousin just topping £1500.

The Black and White trade was good if there was flesh and a bit of shape, but the very lean end was more difficult to place.

The top Friesians were shown jointly by Bill Cowling and Rosie Dunn, both of which made 189p/kg. Alan Sykes then had a bull on 186p and Charles Alden 180p.

Our Clean trade was this week led by Chris Rook with two cattle making 245p and 244p respectively.

Then came the Dean Family with four home bred Limousins making from 243p down to 234p/kg; and Les Thompson followed on 231p/kg with N Hall & Son on 229p.

The dearest steer came from Pat Beal on 227p/kg.

The OTM's were a mixed bag but followed the general trade and Richard Oxendale had an overage steer make 179p with Edward Wilkin on 171p, the dearest Friesian came from Nun Monkton Estate on 138p/kg.

There was a select show of 267 sheep of which 238 were lambs and 29 cull ewes.

The trade has slipped during the week and struggled to average 170p on the day.

The top pens of lambs all made over £2/kg and they were led by Andrew Dobson on 221p with G B Harrison on 217p, M A Lord 216p and G N Jewitt 212p/kg.

On a headage basis Andrew again topped the market on £97 with G B Harrison and G N Jewitt both hitting £87 and E Stonehouse on £84.50.
