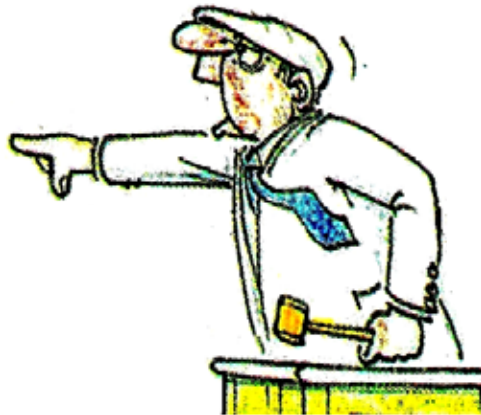

## **FAT CATTLE**

Numbers were again affected by a brilliant day of sunshine and there were 187 put through the ring.

Trade is still very strong with the Continental averages closing up towards 210p/kg.

The 111 young bulls were led by Pam Gibson's home-bred Blonde making 229p and weighing 602kg. Pam continues to produce the most wonderful cattle and they are a credit to her stockman ship.

Keith Bowes and Mike Towse both had British Blue bulls making 226p with Millington Estate and Les Thompson hitting 221p/kg. On a headage basis Derek Woolhouse's pure bred Limousin added up to £1616 with Frank Pickering's bull also making £1597.

The black and whites averaged 170p/kg and David Grassam produced an outstanding Friesian to make 208p/kg which is a record for the market. Andrew Cook then had a bull on 199p with Doug Shirt on 188p/kg.

Clean cattle were desperately short and Les Thompson had the top two in the market taking pride of place with a heifer on 242p/kg which was bought by Peter Hogg of Fletchers; and a steer which made 238p/kg bought by David Penny. Behind them John Edgar and C W Walker both had Continentals making 237p/kg.

A good show of 39 OTM's filled out the numbers and top price was a strong young bull from England Brothers making 209p and adding up to £1517.

C W Walker then had an overage heifer on 197p/kg with the dearest Friesian coming from Brian Ackroyd on 149p/kg.

Let's hope we can get a bit of harvest done this week and back to normal next Monday.

There were 362 sheep in the market of which 282 were this seasons lambs. Trade is reasonable without being exciting at around 175p/kg average.

Top pen this week was produced by R Wilson on 212p/kg, Andrew Dobson having another pen on 203p and E S Thorpe on 194p/kg.

On a headage basis Richard Suddaby produced a pen to make £86.80 with Andrew Dobson on £86, with R Wilson, Wilton Lodge and S Asquith on £82.50.

Cull ewes continue to be a strong trade making up to £95/head.

We had a good week with 461 pigs being marketed of which 291 came into the market on Monday. The live trade was just holding steady at around 113p/kg but needs to improve to keep pace with the price of feed.

Top pen this week was produced by Fred Horsley on 121p/kg.

He was followed by Andrew Thompson with two pens making 119p and Peter Ownsworth who also hit the same target. The Beevers family made 116p/kg of their best pen of gilts.

The 170 deadweight pigs were sold with the cutters on 156p/kg and the bacon pigs 152p/kg.
