FATSTOCK REPORT MONDAY 5TH MARCH 2012

FAT CATTLE

Early on Monday morning there looked like being a shortage of cattle but by the time we started to sell there was a good show of 239 although this was made up by 49 OTM's to balance for a shortage of Clean Cattle.

The Continentals in both the bull and clean section were just an outstanding trade averaging a penny short of 200p/kg.

In the bulls David Etherington took poll position with a home-bred Limousin at 222p which went to Alec Traves.

Keith Bowes then had two bulls make 218 and 220p/kg followed by Edgar Brothers and Pat Beal on 217p/kg.

I should make special mention of Patrick Beal who had an outstanding run of 10 bulls nearly all of which made 200p/kg or more.

His best bull added up to £1603; although he was beaten by Doug Shirt who had a British Blue add up to £1667.

The Black and White bulls were scarce and pricey with the best Friesian coming from Bernard and Richard Henley making 205p.

David Jones and Doug Shirt both had bulls on 186p/kg with Charles Alden on 182p and Guy Cowling 179p/kg.

The 80 Clean Cattle were a stronger trade than last week and Brian Pearson led the field at 233p for a Limousin heifer. David Jackson was on 229p with Pam Gibson 228p and Rob Hall with Chris Robinson on 221p/kg.

Our OTM's this week more than made up the numbers and the top price of 183p was shared by Peter Rhodes and John Lambert. C & T Parker followed with a Limousin cow on 175p/kg with Pete Johnson with his stock bull making 168p/kg and adding up to £1463.

The trade is still strong and the best spot to sell your cattle is in the Auction Ring.

Buyers tell me that there is some resistance but the numbers are still scarce.

FAT SHEEP

Stephen Burley had a select show of 282 sheep of which 258 were hoggs. The trade held itself together for the medium weight lambs at 200p/kg but it was more difficult to find buyers for the heavy sheep weighing around 50kg live weight.

The top pen was shown by J W Jewitt at 222p/kg with Wilton Lodge on 221p, Andrew Dobson 218p and Richard Clark 214p/kg.

On a headage basis Willow Garth had a pen of 50kg sheep make £104/head; J W Jewitt hit £98.50 and then M L Parvin on £96/head.

The 24 ewes were a good trade making up to £111.
