Trade was dearer on the week with Young Bulls bouncing back and Clean Cattle holding firm; numbers were tight and it was definitely felt. Trade was electric.

Young Bulls topped at 245p/kg, 237p/kg both from Keith Bowes purchased by A B P Ltd. Nipping at his heels was Wagstaff Bros at 236p/kg and Edgar Bros at 234p/kg.

Doug Shirt's bulls topped on a headage basis at £1533.54, £1499.74 with F & R M Pickering at £1484.52.

Clean Cattle topped at 266p/kg from P Gibson to C Wasteney & Sons, Sheffield. Wagstaff Bros weren't far behind at 258p/kg to J Penny & Sons, with S Oldfield 257p/kg to J D Sissons next.

Wilton Lodge Farms topped on a headage basis at £1566.63 to J Penny & Sons and also £1492.81, £1453.09.

OTMs held against the falling national trade topping at 161p/kg from Wilton Lodge Farms or £1487.07 from K G Clarke.

You need to ensure that you hold sufficient entitlements for your claimable area of farmed land by 31st December 2014

If you hold an excess of entitlements then these will be lost in 2015.

The minimum claim size in 2015 will be 5 hectares.

This sale included some excellent, well maintained and modern arable machinery and, as expected, it attracted considerable interest from across the country as well as abroad.

Our extensive database of over 44,000 customers registered through our website and York Machinery Sales, together with the promotion through i-bidder, is invaluable for sales of this type and ensures extensive coverage to achieve full value for all the lots in the sale. Prospective purchasers were able to view the catalogue and detailed photographs prior to auction, enabling appropriate homework to be done and a greater confidence to travel to the sale.

On sale day buyers were present from Aberdeen, Inverness, Devon, Warwickshire, Kent, and Ireland, as well as across Yorkshire and the North of England. In addition, the sale was run live on i-bidder which attracted further buyers from Denmark, Ireland, Poland, Wales, Sussex, Stranraer, Essex and many other counties across England; all of whom bid live online for lots in the sale.

The principle lot of the day was a 2008 NH CX8080 combine bought for £110,000 to go to another good Yorkshire home after fighting off strong Scottish opposition. The Sam Vision 3.0 24m sprayer attracted considerable interest, with probably 10 or 12 farmers keen to buy, but eventually selling for £84,000, again to a good Yorkshire home.

The NH T7070 tractor (2010) realised £47,800, having been chased all the way by a buyer on i-bidder from Denmark and the MF 7490 tractor (2006) ended up going down to Devon at £29,500.
