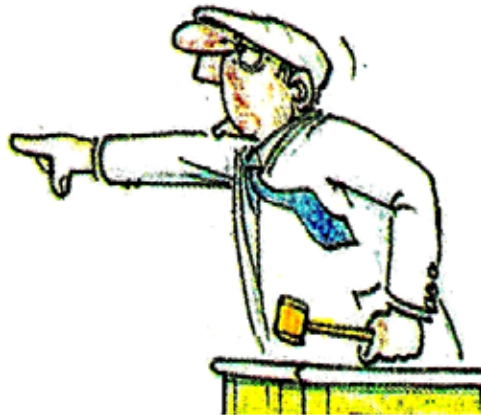

FAT CATTLE

What a difference in atmosphere, trade and numbers which seems to fly against the recent rumblings of consumer resistance.

We had a good show of 285 cattle of which 118 were clean, 152 bulls and 15 OTMs.

For the first time in many a week normal service was resumed on the continental cattle which all averaged over 200p per kilo. The young bull section was led by Richard Newby whose home bred Limousins gratifyingly topped out at 223p and 222p respectively.

Pam Gibson also had a homebred bull on 222p with Wilton Lodge on 221p and Derek Ravis 220p.

On a headage basis the Newby family again made the highest price of £1490 with their other bull on £1488 and Derek Nesom on £1477.

The black and whites were just as good to sell provided they had a bit of flesh and shape.

Norman Colley produced the best British Friesian to hit 192p per kilo with Doug Shirt on 190p Guy Cowling 189p and Basil Aconley together with Richard Button on 188p per kilo.

In this section Doug had a massive black and white bull weighing 864kg which added up to £1576.

It was however the clean cattle which stole the show and there was an outstanding parade of quality animals from our producers.

Simon Foster deservedly led the field with a blonde heifer making 240p per kilo; close behind was Les Thompson with two British blue heifers on 237p and 235p with Pip Dale making 234p and 230p.

Ed Wilkin brought 700kg steers that added upto over £1400 per head and David Jackson had the highest price steer making 224p per kilo.

The OTMs were not as plentiful but Simon Foster had an over age heifer which made 176p with Geoff Wrigglesworth on 173p and the highest price Friesian coming from David Collinson at 150 per kilo.

There was a much better show in the sheep market with 445 on parade of which 415 were lambs.

Thankfully the trade has steadied and the averages were again all over 200p per kilo.

The highest priced pen this week was shown by Richard Suddaby who made 228p per kilo M A Lord on 222p, Charles Mills 215p and Richard Dove 213p per kilo.

On a headage basis David Brown had a pen make £91 with Richard Suddaby and E Stonehouse both hitting £90 per head.

PIGS

Like the other two species pigs have also now levelled out and lifted slightly but they need to do so to keep paying the expensive feed bills.

In the week we moved 573 pigs of which 283 came in live on Monday.

The auction averages hovered around 116p per kilo and Andrew Thompson produced the top 4 pens making from 130p down to 123p per kilo.

Fred Horsley also hit 123p with C E Stonehouse on 122p and M Ward on 121p per kilo.

On the deadweight we sold 290 pigs and the cutters averaged 166p with the baconers making up to 153p per kilo.
