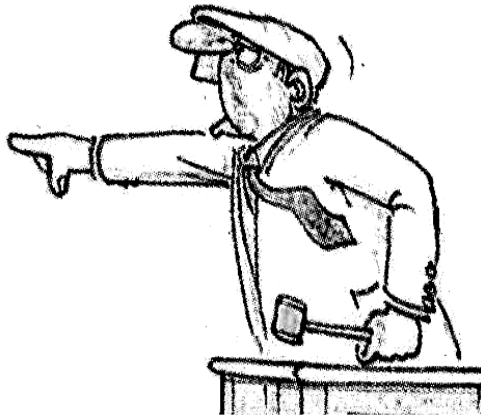

FATSTOCK REPORT MONDAY 13TH FEBRUARY 2012

FAT CATTLE

Just when you think cattle can't get any dearer they move up another notch, and Monday was just such a day with 232 forward and some nice quality amongst them.

The Continental bulls and steers averages 197p/kg but the Continental heifers touched 206p for the first time.

The Young Bulls were headed up by Keith Bowes who made 223p/kg followed by Mark Bulmer on 222p, John Dale 219p and C J Brownbridge 218p/kg.

More importantly there were 20 bulls that made £2 or more during the day.

On a headage basis Frank Pickering's 924 kilo Charolais giant added up to £1760 which is a record for the market. Bill Massey braved the M62 from Cheshire to have an 840 kilo Limousin make £1617 and C J Brownbridge made £1576.

These are pretty staggering sums although replacements are bad to find.

The Black and White trade was equally good with averages almost at 160p.

The highest priced British Friesian was shown by Doug Shirt on 192p with Malcolm Copeland on 190p, David Jones and Gareth Taylor both on 188p/kg.

It was also a first when Gareth Taylor's British Friesian bull added up to £1271.

Our Clean Cattle were full of quality with Les Thompson eventually coming out on top with a lightweight Limousin heifer making 238p/kg. Richard Henley followed up on 236p with David Walshaw 231p and Bryan Pearson 230p/kg.

The dearest steer was shown by the Hutchinson's family at Wilton Lodge on 219p/kg.

Rounding off a good day in the cattle ring, there were 24 OTM's which made up to 195p/kg for an overage steer from Richard Dove.

Bill Massey also had two overage cattle make 194 and 191p/kg; and the dearest Black and White cow came from Tony Wake at 133p/kg.

On a headage basis Mike Wills had a heavy pen make £105 and G R Hawkins also passed the magical figure at £103/head.

There would be another 20 pens that made £90 or more.

The cull ewes were in strong demand with the best pen making £117.
