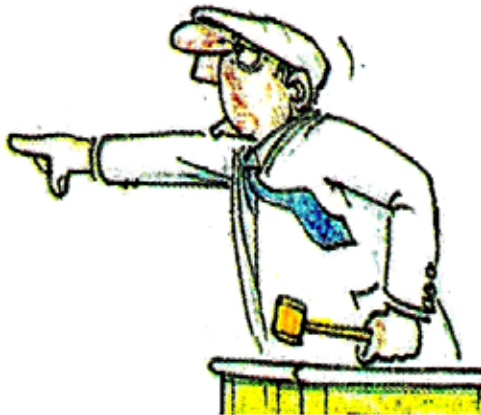

FAT CATTLE

Cattle supplies continue to be very scarce and especially the clean cattle were short today. We had a total of 141 cattle of which 83 were bulls, 28 clean and 30 OTM's. Trade is still good with the Continentals averaging well over 200p/kg.

In the young bulls Keith Bowes again took pride of place with 2 bulls making 228p and 221p respectively. He was followed by a pair of bulls making 211p from Wagstaff Brothers and G Hazlehurst and then both Ed Hardcastle and Nigel Ogg had British Blue bulls on 209p/kg.

On a headage basis Frank Pickering had a splendid Limousin weighing 814kg and adding up to £1672.

Les and David England produced 2 well finished heavyweights to make £1542 and £1492; and Derek Pickering made £1473.

The Black and White bulls were a decent trade averaging 170p/kg and the best Friesian came from Doug Shirt and made a groundbreaking price of 199p/kg.

Alan Sykes also had a wonderful shaped Black and White making 195p/kg with Gareth Thompson on 186p and Derek Milner 181p/kg.

The clean cattle were an excellent trade with Richard Newby topping the market with a homebred heifer at 248p/kg; N Hall & Son followed up on 247p with Les Thompson on 246p/kg.

The highest priced steer was shown by G Hazlehurst with a British Blue making 230p/kg.

The OTM cattle made up to a top of 161p for an overage Limousin steer from F E Norman with Richard Oxendale making 151p for an overage Simmental; and the highest priced Friesian made 120p from J Goodall & Sons.

We desperately do need more cattle to keep our buyers round the ring and if you can notify Tom Stephenson before the weekend it would be a great help.

There were 225 sheep in the market of which 168 were lambs and 57 cull ewes. Trade is pretty steady averaging about 168p/kg and the best couple of pens came from Chris Sowray making 190p.

Brian Robinson made 189p, Andrew Dobson 186p and David Bristow 185p/kg.

On a headage basis Chris Sowray's best pen made £88.50 and then both David Bristow and Brian Robinson made £79.50.

There is definitely space for more sheep at York to fulfil the demand.

FAT PIGS

Our total fat pigs sold for the week added up to 473 of which 253 came into the market live on Monday and 220 went on the deadweight system.

Out auction trade held up to average 118p/kg with the top pen this week of gilts from B Blackburn at 132p/kg; he was followed by the Beevers family and Andrew Thompson both of whom hit 130p and then R Robinson on 128p/kg.

The deadweight trade has moved forward with the cutters making 167p and the bacon pigs 164p/kg.
