FAT CATTLE

With the increasing value of the £ against the Euro, export has been more difficult in recent weeks and the edge has slipped off the trade. Nevertheless all fat cattle look a good price and we shouldn't complain.

We had 285 cattle on Monday of which 133 were clean, 109 bulls and 43 OTM's.

The Continental trade was pretty steady throughout the day holding up at 194p. In the bull section top price went to Derek Woolhouse with a pure bred Limousin making 225p before being bought by Tim Garside.

Next in line was Keith Bowes who made 224p followed by Pam Gibson and Quarryside Farms on 219p, and Keith Rennison 217p/kg.

On a headage basis David Burkill topped the market with a home bred Charolais making £1508 but this pales into insignificance against his outstanding bull that he sold at Carlisle recently.

Next was Frank Pickering who made £1474, Pam Gibson on £1463 and Derek Woolhouse £1453.

Black and White cattle looked a shade easier averaging around 155p/kg. The best priced British Friesian came from Basil Aconley who made 188p with Gareth Taylor and Doug Shirt both hitting 179p and Roger Birkley 178p/kg.

In the clean section we had some very good cattle and the top spot was shared by Les Thompson and Pam Gibson who both produced heifers to make 238p/kg.

Peter Johnson then had a heifer on 234p with Simon Foster making 228p/kg.

The highest priced steer was shown by Richard Dove who made 222p. There were more OTM's about this week and the highest price was achieved by Peter Johnson with an overage steer making 197p/kg with Steve Oldfield hitting 195p, Richard Dove 181p and John Rycroft 180p/kg.

The highest priced Friesian cow came from Ed Wilkin making 149p/kg.

There was a reasonable show of 439 sheep on Monday of which 314 were lambs, 71 hoggs and 54 cull ewes.

The lamb trade was slightly better averaging 215p through the market and making up to a top price of 242p for a pen shown by Richard Dove.

M Lister and David Bristow made 239p with A Theakstone on 237p and M & J Smith 235p/kg.

Headage wise it is only Mr Theakstone that could top £102 for an odd show stopping lamb.

After him E Stonehouse managed £99 with G Jibson and T King on £98.

The ewe trade holds itself together making up to a top of £106 and averaging £85.20.
