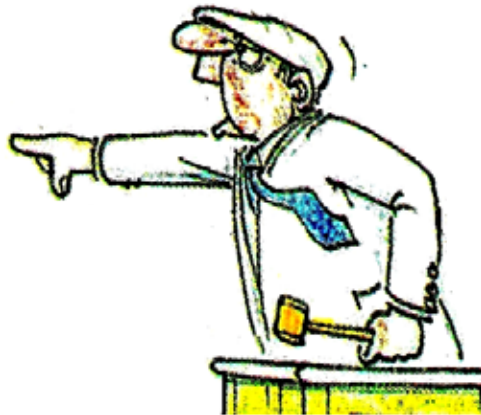

## **MARKET REPORT MONDAY 16<sup>TH</sup> JULY**

### **FAT CATTLE**

The impending Olympic Games don't seem to be having the anticipated effect on our cattle trade and the edge has gone off it in the last 7 days.

Averages for the Continentals were still respectable hovering just under 200p/kg.

We had forward 225 cattle of which 78 were clean, 126 bulls and 21 OTM's. In the bull section it was Derek Ravis who topped the day with a splendid Limousin bull making 229p/kg before being bought by Brian Glaves.

Keith Bowes then had a British Blue on 224p, Barry Wagstaff 221p and Richard Baxter 215p/kg.

On a headage basis Doug Shirt produced an enormous Blue bull to weigh 920kg and add up to £1531.

John Brewster made £1498 and Bob Schofield £1472 of their mature bulls.

In the Black and White section trade was difficult to manage especially if the cattle were short of flesh.

The top Friesian came from Ed Hardcastle who made 183p/kg; with David Grassam and Doug Shirt both hitting 177p/kg.

Our OTM's this week were headed by H Walker who had two over-age heifers make 185p and 180p respectively.

The dearest Friesian steer came from Ed Wilkin on 163p with the best Black and White cow making 129p from E Hall & Son.

## **FAT SHEEP**

Conversely to cattle, our fat sheep trade improved this week and we had 528 on offer including 478 new season lambs. The averages hovered around 195p with the lightweights topping 200p/kg.

The best lamb of the day was shown by J & K Holdings on 256p/kg and adding up to the magical £100/head.

Next came Andrew Dobson on 238p with Mark Lofthouse on 230p and Askham Bryan College 210p/kg.

Headage wise behind J & K Holdings came Andrew Dobson on £95, Sam Beachell and John Dale both hit £90 with Mark Lofthouse on £89.50.

The ewe trade continues to hold up with the best heavyweights making £103/head.
