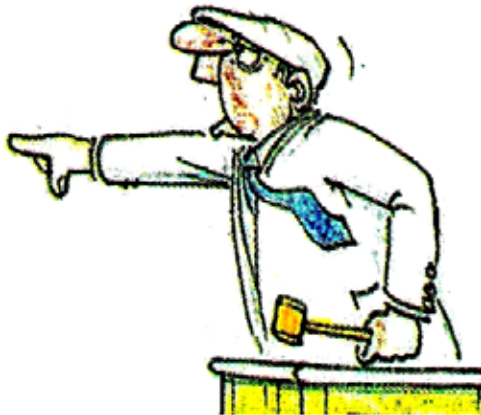

**FATSTOCK REPORT**  
**MONDAY 16<sup>TH</sup> APRIL 2012**

**FAT CATTLE**

We had a splendid show of 283 cattle of which 152 were clean, 95 bulls and 36 OTM's.

It is strange how the balance has swung away from bulls increasing conversely the number of clean cattle. I think this is because with high corn prices last year quite a few suckler bulls would be cut and would be now fed through as steers.

As a consequence the young bull trade was as good as we have had with the Continentals averaging 206p.

The best of the day was produced by Keith Bowes in the shape of a British Blue which made 226p/kg.

Close behind was E Stonehouse on 225p, Quarryside Farms 223p and Antony Turnbull 221p/kg.

This outstanding trade fed through to the price per head where the bull from E Stonehouse added up to £1665 with Derek Pickering making £1642 and John Brewster £1557.

The Black and White's kept the trade up provided there was flesh about and some Vendors were in particularly good form.

Rosie Dunn topped the market with a Black and White that just made 200p/kg. Richard ETTY then had several bulls making up to 196p and Guy Cowling had another old fashioned Friesian on 179p/kg.

The 152 cattle would have graced many a show ring and top spot eventually went to John Rycroft with a home bred British Blue Heifer making 239p/kg, Mike Towse then had two heifers make 235p and 229p with Les Thompson on 228p/kg. The best steer came from Liz Dale who made 226p and added up to £1551.

On a headage basis Tom Stephenson had a 750kg steer that added up to £1579 with Liz Dale making £1551 of her best bullock.

The OTM's still keep marching forwards and today's top price went to Andrew Watson with an overage Limousin heifer making 207p/kg. Ed Wilkin had a Blonde steer make 170p and Jack Clappison produced his Limousin stock bull to make 169p and add up to £1553.

There was a better show of 501 sheep in the market and the new season lamb averaged around 247p/kg. The top two pens of lambs came from David Bristow making 293 and 284p respectively with Stuart Craven having two pens close behind on 277p and 270p/kg.

Headage wise David Bristow again topped the market with £121; Richard Suddaby made £117.50 and Derek Pickles £114.

The hogg season is getting towards the end and held itself together with averages at around 200p/kg.

Our deadweight trade saw 175 pigs marketed with the cutters making 150p and the bacon pigs 149p/kg.
