## **FAT CATTLE**

As the weather has continued to frustrate drilling next season's crops, so has it disrupted our marketing patterns this autumn; and we had another mixed show of 178 cattle on Monday.

The Young Bull section was almost back to normal with 112 on offer and although trade was just acceptable it was unexciting and had definitely slipped a few pennies in the week with the Continentals ending up averaging 194p through the market.

Top bull came from Keith Bowes again on 229p/kg with Bill Cowling following up on 224p and much to his credit, young Master Foster on 221p/kg.

On a headage basis it was Simon Foster who produced a British Blue bull to make £1592, Josh Wainwright made £1520 and Richard Newby £1474.

I didn't think the Black and White trade was affected as much as the Continentals and they averaged around 160p/kg.

The best of the Friesians came from Bernard & Richard Henley who shared top spot with Basil Aconley on 179p/kg. Peter Johnson, David Grassam and Doug Shirt all had bulls on 178p/kg.

The Clean trade for the 37 that were forward was more competitive because of the numbers.

Barry Wagstaff topped the league table with a British Blue steer making 247p/kg and he also had another steer on 239p.

In between N Hall & Son had a home bred heifer on 242p with Pam Gibson on 239p and 235p/kg respectively.

The Wagstaff family steer added up to £1388.

On a headage basis M C Collin hit £88 for an odd heavy lamb with Richard Greenbank making £84 for his best pen; Cornborough Farms £82.50 and Andrew Dobson £82.

Our deadweight trade saw 215 pigs through the system with the cutters making 166p and the baconers 163p.
