## **Fatstock Report – Monday 18 June**

### **Fat Cattle**

There were slightly fewer cattle about this week, but a splendid array of quality for our Summer Show, which was judged by Andrew Butterfield.

Les and John Thompson stole the top rosettes, winning the championship with the lightweight Limousin heifer, which went onto make 250p per kilo.

Much to their credit, they also took the heavyweight heifer class and the reserve champion, which made 246p per kilo.

David Jackson won the steer class with a heavyweight that made 226p per kilo and added up to just short of £1,500.

In the bull show, it was rewarding to see two breeders in the final line up and the championship went to the lightweight produced by Malcolm Summerson, going onto make 229p per kilo.

The reserve champion was also bred by Pam Gibson and she, likewise, made 229p per kilo.

It was good to see the event well supported and our thanks to all concerned.

The show not only provides some added interest, but does demonstrate what quality is now coming through York market.

The averages for the day were very similar to last week, with all the continentals making over 200p per kilo. In the bulls, I have already mentioned Malcolm Summerson and Pam Gibson hitting 229p per kilo, but they were joined by Barry Wagstaff, with a Blonde bull.

Close behind, was Keith Bowes on 226p per kilo, Morris & Son 224p per kilo and G H West 223p per kilo.

On a headage basis, Doug Shirt produced a Simmental to make £1,595; Andrew Town had a Limousin on £1,568 and Frank Pickering a British Blue on £1,551.

There was a good selection of fleshed Friesians today, which would average well over 160p per kilo. The highest priced British Friesian came from Basil Aconley on 191p per kilo, with Alan Gaythorpe, Roger Birkley and Rosie Dunn all making 186p per kilo.

The clean cattle averages were dominated by the show and the top 10 were all heifers.

Heading the list was Les Thompson with the champion on 250p per kilo; then came Stuart Gledhill on 248p per kilo, followed by the Thompsons again along with Pam Gibson on 246p per kilo and Rob Hall 244p per kilo.

The highest price steer was fed by J W Mothersdale on 233p per kilo.

Our total consignment on Monday was 264 cattle, of which 113 were clean, 119 bulls and 32 OTMs. The OTMs were just as strong a trade, with Richard Oxendale making 188p per kilo on an average Simmental steer and H Walker with a heifer making 186p per kilo.

I finish by mentioning that Jim Tennant brought a Charolais stock bull, weighing 1275 kilos, which added up to £2,084.
