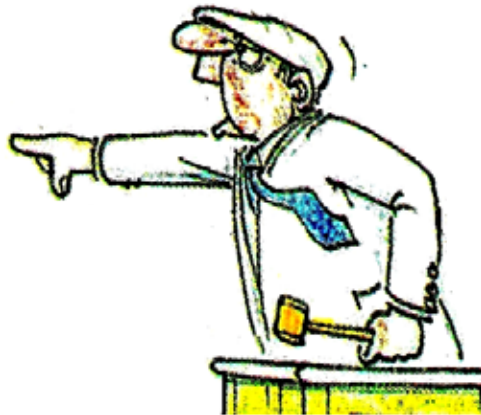

FAT CATTLE

After a pretty lean month there were 244 cattle back in the market on Monday but trade is not exciting especially for the Young Bulls where the Continental average struggled just over 190p/kg compared to Clean Cattle which still held at around 205p/kg.

The 124 Young Bulls were led in the league table by Keith Bowes who had a Limousin make 227p; he was followed by Antony Turnbull on 218p, Pam Gibson 216p and Malcolm Summerson 215p/kg.

On a headage basis it was C W Walker with an enormous mature British Blue bull that added up to £1615 with Andrew Town on £1504 and David Voakes £1457.

The Black and White trade held up much better and nearly averaged 160p.

In this section Doug Shirt had the top three prices coming in at the end of the day from 184p to 179p/kg.

Basil Aconley also hit 179p and there were a plethora of bulls around 165 to 170p/kg.

We did have some good clean cattle today of which the best came from Brian Pearson with a heifer making 248p/kg; John and Les Thompson then had two heifers making 244p which was also hit by Pam Gibson.

John and Hilary Gilbertson then had a home-bred Blonde make 241p and the highest priced steer came from Barry Wagstaff on 235p/kg.

We had 47 OTM's which is more than we have had for a long while. They made up to a top of 170p achieved by Edgar Brothers with a home bred overage Limousin heifer.

On a headage basis Andrew Dobson had a pen make £85; the Beevers Family £84, Richard Greenbank £83 and Nigel Wild £82 per head.
