## **FAT CATTLE**

A blissful sunny day took everyone by surprise and numbers forward were inevitably affected.

In the end we had a respectable show of 182 cattle of which 64 were clean, 97 bulls and 21 OTM's.

As viewed from the Rostrum I would say trade was very marginally better than last week, perhaps by 2-4p/kg.

The Continental young bulls averaged 197p/kg with the top spot going this week to Wagstaff Brothers from Sutton on Forest who showed an outstanding Blonde D'Aquitaine bull making 217p/kg.

Keith Bowes was next in line at 216p with Chris Rooke showing two home bred Belgian Blues to make 214 and 215p; and Edgar Brothers also had a home bred Limousin on 214p/kg.

On a headage basis, Doug Shirt's enormous British Blue bull added up to £1617 whilst Martin Mennell's bull which was first through the ring came to £1606.

The Black and White bulls held their own averaging 171p/kg and the best Friesian was shown by Doug Shirt on 187p with Norman Collier on 183p, John Brewster 178p and Rosie Dunn 176p/kg.

The Continental clean cattle all hovered around 200p/kg and this week Pam Gibson took the first place with a heifer making 246p/kg; she was followed by Tony Barker on 239p, N Hall & Son 237p and Mick Thuey 230p/kg.

The dearest steer was shown by Barry Wagstaff making 229p/kg.

The OTM's held their own as Richard Oxendale brought an overage steer to make 173p and the highest priced Friesian came from Paul Herron on 128p/kg.

It was R Wilson who topped the day on a headage basis with a pen at £96 whilst Carl Fawcett was on £94, Barry Potter £91 and Sam Beachell £89.

The trade is holding up pretty well for the time of year and the ewe trade likewise is following the trend making up to a top of £95.
