FAT CATTLE

The foul weather on Monday saw 174 cattle struggle to get to market and trade was respectable without being exciting.

Averages for the Continentals still exceeded 200p/kg over the day with some good high spots.

The 98 young bulls were headed by 2 splendid animals from Keith Bowes and Malcolm Summerson both of which made 220p/kg. Close behind was Mike Towse on 219p with Bob Schofield and Gareth Taylor hitting 214p/kg.

On a headage basis Doug Shirt continues to break his own record with a 1000kg British Blue bull adding up to £1,912. In second place Cheryl Edwards had an 850kg Simmental make £1,630 and Dick Newby a homebred Limousin on £1,530.

The black and white cattle were no worse to sell and top price for a British Friesian went to Ed Hardcastle on 190p with Doug Shirt making 185p, Norman Collier 184p and Basil Aconley 183p/kg.

There were some nice clean cattle and Les Thompson led the field with a heifer making 248p and a steer making 242p/kg.

Brian Pearson had a British Blue heifer on 241p with Malcolm Bowes making 240p/kg.

On a price per head Tom Stephenson's steer added up to £1,415 with Malcolm Bowes on £1,398 and Les Thompson £1,386.

There were only 9 OTM's in the market with the top price of 162p for a Piedmontese overage heifer.

The highest priced Friesian came from the Galtry family at 141p/kg.

The top two pens came from Andrew Dobson making 183p and 182p with T F Galtry on 179p, Richard Suddaby 178p and G F Pemberton 174p/kg.

There is a temptation for producers to send the lambs straight after weaning and some of those coming through the market could do with a bit more finish.

We moved 421 pigs this week of which 301 came into the market on Monday to the live auction.

Trade is still holding up with the live averages running around 118p/kg.

The best 2 pens of gilts of the day came from Graham West, both making 129p/kg; he was followed by Walloway Farm on 126p with C E Stonehouse 124p and Andrew Thompson with 3 pens on 123p/kg.

The deadweight trade has improved and we sold 120 pigs with the cutters making 161p and the bacon pigs 159p/kg.
