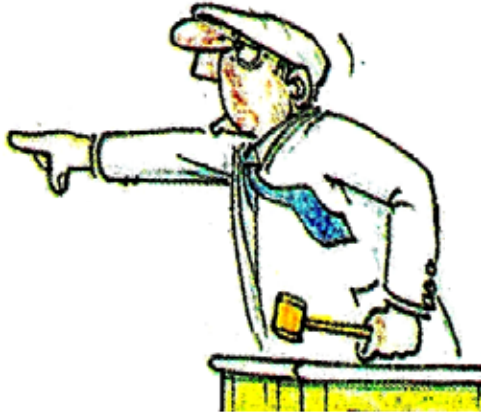

FATSTOCK REPORT
MONDAY 27TH FEBRUARY 2012

FAT CATTLE

We had a good show again of 252, with 137 clean, 91 bulls and 24 OTM's. Bulls were in short supply and as a consequence the trade was significantly better than last week.

The bull section was topped by Quarryside Farms Ltd with a Limousin X Bull weighing 560kg and being purchased by Alec Traves for 223p/kg. M T Bulmer had the next two top prices at 220 and 219p/kg with Keith Bowes having his best bull also at 219p/kg.

The best gross price for a bull was a Limousin X shown by Ed Wilkin making £1539 being purchased by Peter Pearson. S J Marshall, J H Kennington and D Pickering all had bulls over £1450.

The overall average for the bulls was just over 200p/kg.

The black and white bulls averaged 171.5p/kg with a price range of £730 to £1443.

J Cawkwell took poll position with a bull at 197p bought by Peter Pearson, closely followed by Doug Shirt twice with bulls at 196p and 194p/kg.

Doug Shirt took the four top gross prices, with the top price being £1443 and the other three all being above £1260.

Clean cattle were harder to sell and there were more over finished cattle as compared with last week.

The top price of the day was a British Blue heifer shown by T P & E A Clayton making 229p/kg bought by David Penny.

B Pearson was second for a Limousin heifer bought by Jeremy Sissons for 228p/kg and W L Thompson were third with a Limousin heifer at 227p/kg bought by David Penny.

J R Hildreth had the highest price of the day for a Limousin steer coming to £1560 bought by Tim Garside. The Walmsley family had two steers over £1450, Bernard and Richard Henley also had a steer over £1400.

The OTM cattle were a very good trade averaging 136p/kg. The top price was a Limousin steer from F Hairsine at 187p/kg closely followed by Blonde D'Aquitaine heifer from H Walker & Son at 186p/kg. The top gross price was a Limousin cow from S Oldfield coming to £1461.

On a headage basis David Fox's were top price with G H West & Sons on £99 and Willowgarth Farm on £97.50.
