FATSTOCK REPORT MONDAY 28TH MAY 2012

FAT CATTLE

With the sudden sizzling spell of sunshine, combined with restrictions on the housewives purse, I had fully expected Monday would bring a further drop in trade; but exactly the reverse happened and we would improve by around 5p/kg on the week.

All our Continentals averaged just short of 200p/kg despite an acceptable show of 269 cattle in total. There were 121 clean, 122 bulls and 26 OTM's.

Leader in the bull section was Les Thompson this week with a lovely Limousin making 220p followed by a quartet of producers on 216p - P R Walker, Antony Turnbull, Keith Bowes and Gareth Taylor.

Close behind were Andrew Watson and Bernard Henley with John Edgar on 214p/kg.

On a headage basis, Frank Pickering had a pretty massive Charolais bull weighing 778kg add up to £1591; Doug Shirt had a Simmental at £1552 and Dick Brown a Limousin at £1522.

The black and whites were a mixed trade with the watershed definitely being on flesh.

The best British Friesian was shown by Basil Aconley making 187p/kg with Doug Shirt making 105p, Rosie Dunn 183p and Bob Schofield 181p/kg.

Pam Gibson returned to head up the list of clean cattle Vendors just tipping 240p for her Limousin heifer. Next were a trio of Les Thompson, John Rycroft and John Hildreth, all of whom made 239p/kg with Pete Johnson on 238p and Rob Hall 231p/kg.

The highest priced steer was shown by John Hildreth at 239p/kg.

The OTM's followed the upward trend and top price for a young British Blue cow was 166p brought by John Hildreth with one similar on 165p from P R Walker. The dearest Friesian cow was from J Goodall on 138p.
