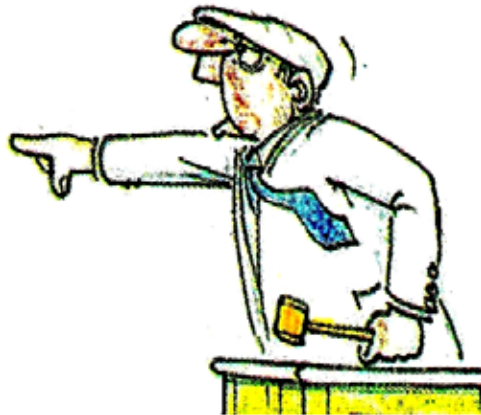

## **FAT CATTLE**

Numbers were again scarce with 176 cattle in total of which 49 were clean, 83 bulls and 44 OTM's. Trade was no better and the bulls particularly were difficult to sell, although no worse than anywhere else. The Continental bull averages were 195p with the clean cattle all over 200p/kg.

Top bull of the day was shown by J & M Dean on 225p/kg with Keith Bowes making 219p, Les Thompson 218p and Geoff Spence 217p/kg.

On a headage basis Doug Shirt had 2 gentle giants add up to £1584 and £1487 respectively.

The black and white trade was pretty steady averaging 157p and Doug Shirt again brought in the best British Friesian at the end of the day to make 180p/kg with Pete Johnson and Roger Birkley following up on 176p and Mark Nicholson and Basil Aconley on 175p/kg.

The clean cattle price league table was headed by David Fox with a heifer on 239p, followed by N Hall & Son on 238p and Ian Swallow on 233p/kg.

The highest priced steers were shown by the Hutchinson family of Wilton Lodge both making 220p/kg.

OTM's are filling a gap at the moment and H Walker & Son had an overage heifer make 176p with Millington Grange on 175p and W H Lockwood 169p/kg.

Best three pens were shown by Andrew Dobson who made from 165 to 177p/kg; following Andrew was M J White on 161p, T S Watson 159p and Richard Greenbank 158p/kg.

On a price per head, Andrew had the best pen at £78 with Richard Greenbank making £76 and Cornborough Farms £74/head.

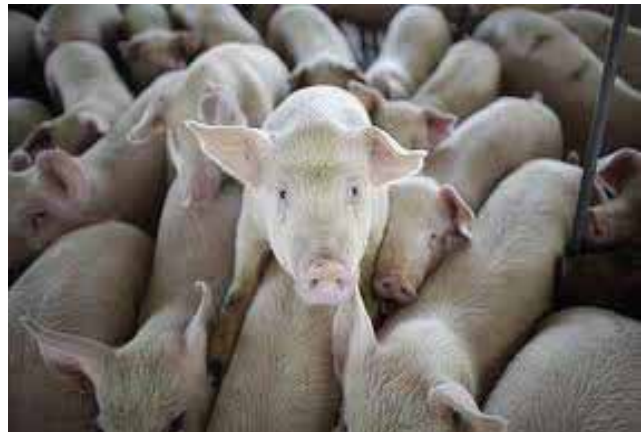
The deadweight system put through 225 pigs with the cutters lifting to 167p and the baconers 164p/kg.
